

LearnerPal: Activity Report

LearnerPal reporting provides users with data needed to make more informed instructional decisions! The data is provided in easy to read reports. Users can drill down in reports to find more detailed information. This document previews the *Activity* report.

Purpose of *Activity* Report: provide Teachers with information on how their classes performed on assigned Activities. Teachers can gain different insights through the *Activity Report*, having the ability to view data by students, or by an aggregated class view.

This Report Helps by providing details on completed activities. Teachers can:

- Understand how their students have progressed within each activity
- Analyze how students/classes performed on activity categories, and activity questions to make informed instructional decisions

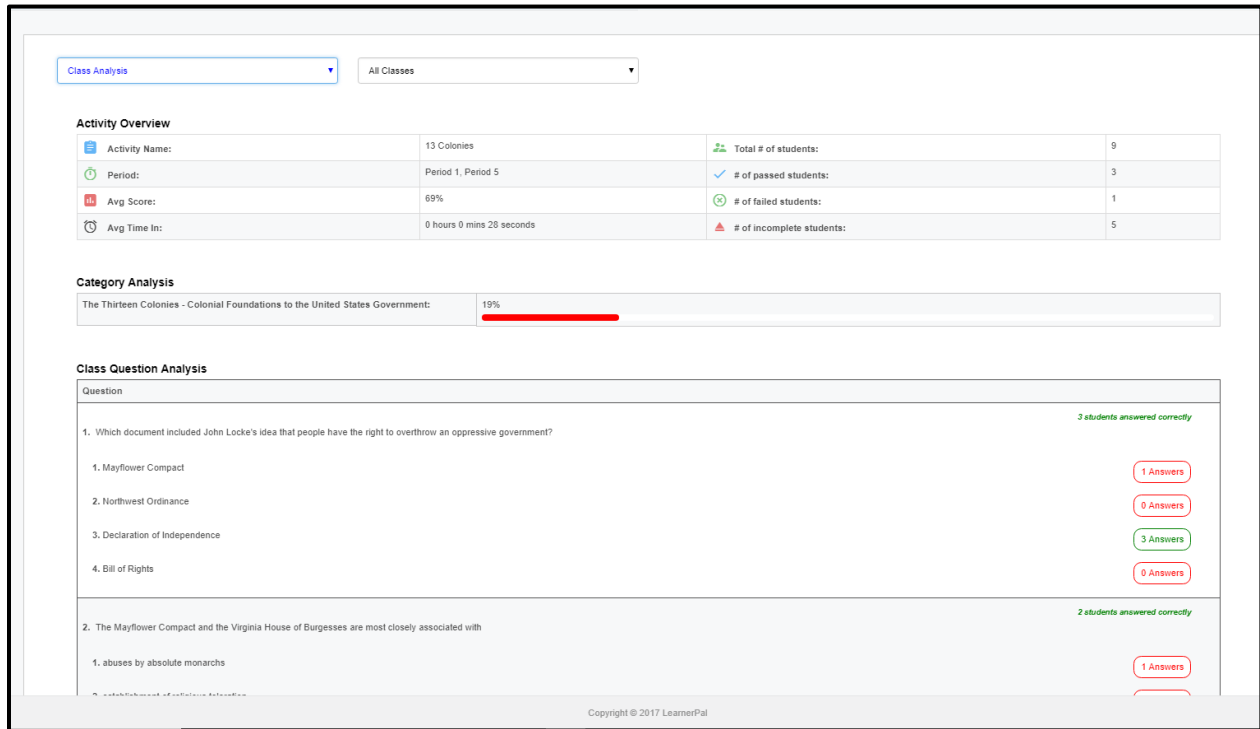

Appendix: Class Analysis



Provides aggregated data on **classes**, based on assigned activities

- Average Score of class on activity
- Average Time In activity
- Class Progress and high level results

Teachers can view and analyze how the class answered on the activity questions:

- How did the class do by category? For activities with multiple categories, this provides insight into what categories may need some extra attention
- How many students answered each question correctly or incorrectly
- What was the breakdown for each question of what the students answered
